On behalf of my fellow MUNISH Board of Directors, it is my great honour to invite you and your students to the 34th annual MUNISH conference. MUNISH 2024 will be held from **Friday November 8<sup>th</sup> - Sunday November 10<sup>th</sup> 2024**. The MUNISH conference is aimed at delegates between the ages of 14 - 19 years. The theme for MUNISH 2024 is **Multilateralism: Building Pathways to Peace and Security**.

The MUNISH mission statement states that MUNISH is 'A conference run by youth, for today's youth, to benefit the youth of tomorrow'. When keeping these values in mind, MUNISH strives to be a conference that takes on the purest form of Model United Nations, allowing students to enjoy a weekend filled with debate, discussion, and evaluation of solutions for a brighter tomorrow. With over 1200 participants, students from all across the world become the diplomats of tomorrow who will reinforce change by taking a critical look at what affects our world today. Participants leave MUNISH with a new outlook on our world and their place in transforming our future. In addition, MUNISH is affiliated to The Hague International Model United Nations (THIMUN). It therefore promotes the educational aims of THIMUN and is conducted based on THIMUN by-laws and procedural rules.

The selected theme for the 34<sup>th</sup> annual MUNISH conference, **Multilateralism: Building Pathways to Peace and Security**, aims to highlight the importance and necessity of multilateral cooperation when navigating today's pressing global challenges. It suggests that collective commitment and efforts extending beyond the interests of a few states are the keys to ensuring sustainable peace and security, in our current world struck by unremitting conflict and instability. With this, the committees and councils of this conference have been carefully selected to focus on issues that align with this theme.

Furthermore, the **Historical Security Council** will allow for a focus on the **year 1962** and the issues of the Cuban Missile Crisis & Congo Crisis (1960-1965), which can also be found on Page 3. For more experienced delegates, joining the **Advisory Panel on the Question of the Red Sea (APQRS)**, will provide a unique and insightful perspective which focuses on the situation in the Red Sea. In addition, the International Court of Justice (ICJ) is a committee for students with a general interest in law, or who are planning on pursuing a career in law, which will tackle the case of **Military and Paramilitary Activities in and against Nicaragua (Nicaragua vs. United States of America)**. Due to the complexity and detail embedded, we advise that the **most experienced delegates** are placed in these committees. Finally, the MUNISH Press Team offers valuable opportunities for students with an interest in journalism or a keen eye in photography, and therefore all such students are encouraged to apply on page 13 below.

The deadline for submission of the School Registration form is Friday April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024. In order for us to accommodate all potential participants, it is crucial that the form is submitted by this deadline. We do not need the names of the participants but the provisional number of delegation(s) you would like assigned to your school.

The School Registration Form (Form 1) and the Student Officers and Press Team Applications will be filled in and submitted digitally. The links to these forms can be found on pages 12-15 of this mailing. Once this is done, the Board of Directors will allocate member states, non-member delegations, and Student Officer positions, to be published in the Second Mailing in mid-May. You will then be able to assign students to your delegations through our digital registration system (Form 2) which will be up and running in mid-May through September 2024..

We look forward to welcoming you and your students to our school in the City of Peace and Justice in November 2024 for an enriching and memorable experience.

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#### Cancellation Deadline & Cancellation fee

If for unforseen circumstances a delegate or whole delegation is suddenly unable to attend MUNISH 2024, a cancellation must be e-mailed to the Secretariat (<u>munish.secretariat@ishweb.nl</u>) by **Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2024** to <u>avoid</u> a €150 cancellation fee. This will be confirmed in the form of a reply to the cancellation email.

#### **Subsidised Travel Cards**

Delegates arriving from countries outside the Netherlands may have the option of purchasing a travel card from us providing access to all public transport systems in The Hague. We strongly advise this purchase as the Dutch Transport System uses a system that is both expensive and impractical for short visits. This year, MUNISH will again be offering the "Congreskaarten"/travel cards that holders can use to take any public transport around The Hague (unlimited) for 3 - 7 days. These travel cards are a great success every year! The card will allow holders to take the trams or buses to and from school and to any other locations they may wish to see in The Hague. These will be priced at €22,05 per person for 4 days and will be available to anyone who takes part in the conference. This means that by using the travel card, cardholders could save up to €20 in travelling costs per person. If some schools want the cards for an extra 5th

day, they will need to pay an extra €5,30 per person for a total of €27,05 per person for 5 days.

However, if you choose not to purchase one of these tickets you have two other alternatives: you could buy a ticket each time you travel which costs €4 and is valid for 2 hours, so if students were to take 2 trips a day (to and from the conference). This would cost €8 each day. There is also a day card which costs €7,10 per day for unlimited travel. The travel card we offer is therefore by car the cheapest alternative. Purchasing these cards, which we have specially negotiated with the travel company HTM, are also significantly cheaper to use in comparison to the conventional OV-chip travel cards.



The digital travel card request form will be included in the Second Mailing in June. You will then be requested to order the travel cards no later than **Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> of September 2024.** 

### **Hotels (No Community Housing)**

Please note that there is no community housing. However, MUNISH has negotiated with local hotels to offer you the best rates and affordable accommodations. #### **General Conduct and Policies**

It is of great importance that all participants are reminded of their individual and collective responsibility to ensure a successful conference by behaving with diplomatic conduct at all times throughout the conference.

### **Participant's Responsibility**

It is the responsibility of the participants to conduct themselves appropriately, exhibiting traits of leadership, diplomacy, and dignity throughout the duration of this conference. After all, the participants will not only be representing their delegation, but also their own school as well as MUNISH as a whole. Students are to produce resolutions or other work that is of **their own creation**. **Plagiarism of any form will not be tolerated**.

This also includes their behaviour outside the conference, in hotels and within the city of The Hague in general. It is important that MUN Directors therefore select students that are dedicated and responsible so they are certain that the students will behave accordingly during the conference but also within their hotels and in the city of The Hague.

### **MUN Director's Responsibility**

All participants must be accompanied by **at least one** adult MUN-Director or chaperone. The MUN-Director is the main representative of the school, but most of all responsible for organising the participation of their school. They are responsible for making arrangements for travelling, accommodation, organising the delegation but also training the delegation. MUN-Directors or chaperones should be in the conference building when needed and should supervise their delegation when the conference is in session. Also, outside the conference they will be held responsible for the conduct of their delegates as well as in their hotels.

# **Conduct in the Conference Building**

Formal clothing is required for MUN-Directors and participants when the conference is in session. They should be wearing **formal attire** that actual UN-Delegates would wear to a session of the UN. Furthermore, military uniforms, national costumes, facial piercings, tattoos, and any form of informal attire are **strictly prohibited** as they may cause discomfort amongst other delegates or staff during the conference.

Please note that **Administrative Staff** as well as Executive Staff consist of volunteers who only commit time and effort to assist delegates and Student Officers and should be respected at all times. All participants must be considerate towards them at all times.

# **Smoking and Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages**

**Smoking** and consumption of **alcoholic beverages** or **narcotic drugs** are strictly forbidden at all times in and during the conference. Smoking is allowed outside the building in **designated areas** around the premises. Use of mobile phones is prohibited for all participants and they must be switched off during the conference sessions to avoid disruption.
